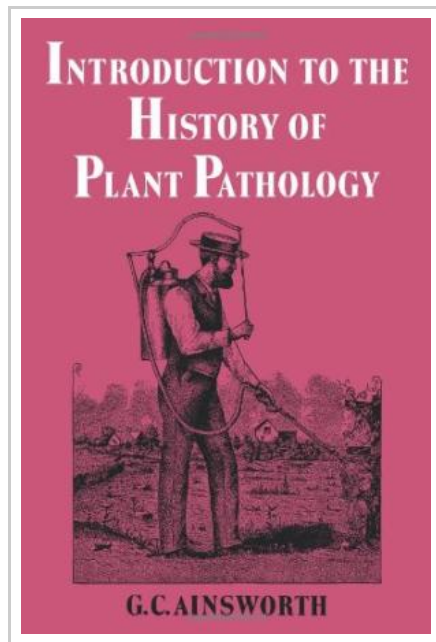




Introduction to the History of Plant Pathology
