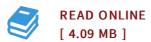




## Experiments in General Chemistry Introduction to Chemical Analysis

This little book is a translation of the papyrograph notes, the principal part of which was prepared by Professor Volhard while in charge of the work in inorganic chemistry in the laboratory of the University of Munich. The notes were afterwards continued and completed by Professor Zimmermann, as nearly as possible in the spirit of the first part. I have been familiar with the original notes for some time, and have felt that their use in American laboratories would be in the interest of thorough instruction in general chemistry. A few years ago Dr. Edward Renouf, who had been connected with the laboratory of Munich for a number of years, and who had been a student and assistant of Professor Volhard, was engaged as assistant in the laboratory of the Johns Hopkins University. As he was thoroughly familiar with the Volhard system, this offered a good opportunity to introduce it. A ccordingly, Dr. Renouf undertook the translation of the book, and it was issued in the form of papyrograph sheets. In this form it has been in use in the laboratory...
